Beef Cattle Specific Rules

The beef cattle show rules are in addition to those listed in “Junior General Rules and Regulations” on wistatefair.com.

Junior beef cattle exhibitors may enter and show **no more than 3 animals** in the junior beef department with **no more than 2 steers**. Exhibitors *MAY NOT ENTER* more animals than the total allowed to show. A market steer may be shown in more than one division (market, performance and bred and owned), if the steer meets each division’s qualifications and is entered appropriately.

Examples:

- 1) Sally is entering steer A and steer B in the market show but not entering them in the performance or bred and owned divisions. Sally would NOT be able to enter different steers (steer C and steer D) into the performance or bred and owned division.
- 2) Sally is entering steer A in the market show and the bred owned market steer division but not entering steer A in the performance division. Sally may enter a different steer (steer B) in the performance division.
- 3) Sally is only entering steers A and B in the performance division but not entering them in the market or bred and owned market steer divisions. Sally would not be able to enter any other steers.

Substitutions: Substitutions may be made within the department for any entered animal as follows:

- A. **Registered Breeding Stock:** At time of entry, junior exhibitors may **declare** one (1) potential registered substitute animal for each registered breeding animal entered. Substitute registered breeding animals **must** have complete information submitted with entry (class, birthdate, tattoo, name and registration number). Registration certificates for potential substitutes do not need to be submitted at the time of entry.
- B. **DNA identified:** Any animals which have been **DNA identified** by the exhibitor/sibling with Wisconsin State Fair **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024**, do not need to be declared as substitutes; all are eligible.
- C. After the entry deadline, an exhibitor may activate either a declared substitute animal(s) or animal(s) 840 ear tag/DNA identified by the exhibitor/sibling with Wisconsin State Fair.
 - i. **By July 24th** –To activate a substitute animal, send an email to entryoffice@wistatefair.com stating the exhibitor name, name of animal being dropped, name of animal substitute being activated and attach a copy of the substitute animal’s registration certificate or 840 ear tag/DNA identification.
 - ii. **After July 24th** – To activate a substitute animal, notify the department staff at check in and present the animal’s registration certificate or 840 ear tag/DNA identification.

Animal Registration: A breed association issued individual registration certificate for all registered animals must be submitted to Fair management at check-in. Emails directly from breed associations to verify registration will be accepted. Cattle without proper registration or not entered and checked in by the Junior Beef Cattle Department staff on time will not be allowed to show. Tattoos must be legible, in place prior to the animal’s arrival at the Fair and match the animal’s registration certificate. Tattoos will be verified with registration certificates. Calves shown at the side of a cow must be registered and tattooed.

At any show for which a breed association appropriates funds toward the payment of prize money, authorized representatives of the association have the authority to enforce the respective breed association’s rules in addition to Wisconsin State Fair rules. In situations where the organization’s rule(s) and Wisconsin State Fair conflicts, Wisconsin State Fair rules will be used.

Non-State Fair Animal Show Waiver: It is intended that all animals be housed in Wisconsin and under the daily care and supervision of the exhibitor from the time of entry deadline (breeding stock) or DNA identification (market animals and non-registered breeding stock) through the end of the Junior Show rotation at Wisconsin State Fair. During that time, the animal(s) entered may only be shown by the exhibitor, immediate family (brother, step-brother, sister, step-sister, mother, step-mother, father, step-father, or legal guardian – with proof of relationship) or family farm, **unless a Non-State Fair Animal Show Waiver has been obtained in advance.**

If a junior show exhibitor anticipates that someone other than the exhibitor, immediate family member or family farm may show a project animal after the junior has either entered Wisconsin State Fair or DNA identified the animal, a waiver request must be completed by the entry deadline. *Failure to obtain a waiver in advance of the animal being shown by anyone other than those listed above may result in the animal being disqualified from Wisconsin State Fair participation and any awards, ribbons and prize money being forfeited.*

Waiver requests may be found at wistatefair.com/competitions/junior-livestock/. Waiver requests will be considered on an individual basis by Wisconsin State Fair management, who reserve the right to further review situations with outside sources. Requests will be approved or denied by June 15th.

Waiver requests must be made by emailing the waiver request form to entryoffice@wistatefair.com by May 22, 2024.

Dehorning of animals is recommended for safety.

Bedding: Exhibitors are responsible for bringing or purchasing their own cattle bedding.

Tie Outs: Cattle may only be placed in the designated tie out area and are placed there at the exhibitor's risk. Wisconsin State Fair assumes no liability for any incidents or actions that may occur in the tie out area.

- A. Tie out bedding is not provided.
- B. Tie outs are issued upon arrival; if necessary, they will be assigned in advance.
- C. Cattle may not be moved from barns to the tie out area before 7 pm daily; they must be returned to the barn by 8 am daily.
- D. Neck ropes and/or double ties must be used in the tie out area. Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to make tie out adjustments for all cattle not properly tied or equipped at the owner's expense.
- E. No pens are allowed in the tie out area without prior approval.
- F. Cattle placed in the tie outs are at the exhibitor's risk. Wisconsin State Fair assumes no liability for any incidents or actions that may occur in the tie out area.
- G. Failure to abide by tie out procedures may result in disqualification, withholding of prize money and/or losing eligibility for future shows.

BEEF BREEDING SHOW

The Breeding Show Entry Information is in addition to the "Junior General Rules and Regulations" located on wistatefair.com.

1. **Entries** with complete information and fees must be submitted online to Wisconsin State Fair by the entry deadline.
 - A. **Breeding Females:** Must provide breed, class, birthdate, tattoo, name and registration number. Registered breeding females shown in the breeding division do not need to be 840 ear tag or DNA identified.
 - B. **A copy of the official breed registration certificate for registered breeding females must be submitted with entry by May 22, 2024. Late registration certificates will only be accepted until July 1st.** Registration certificates can be submitted by:
 - i. *Uploading a pdf copy with online entries at time of entry – OR –*
 - ii. *Emailing a pdf copy to entryoffice@wistatefair.com (including exhibitor's name in email).*
2. **Breed Divisions:** To qualify as a breed division (except commercial) there must be a minimum of four (4) exhibitors and ten (10) head with proper breed documentation checked in at the Fair. Proper breed documentation is a registration certificate from a respective breed association verifying entered animal parentage. Breeds with proper breed documentation which do not meet the minimum number of exhibitor or head criteria will be placed in the Any Other Breed (AOB) Division with the following guide:
 - A. Breed division with parent verification requirements of 75% and greater will show in the High Percentage Any Other Breed Division (i.e. Shorthorns - 15/16 or greater, and Simmentals - 7/8 or greater)
 - B. Breed division with parent verification requirements of 74% and lower will show in the Low Percentage Any Other Breed Division (*Exception:* Cattle registered as Shorthorn Plus which are 7/8 or less and Foundation Simmentals which are 50% to 75% will show in this low percentage division)
 - C. Registered Foundation Simmentals and Shorthorn Plus cattle with parent verification requirements which are less than 50% will show as Commercial Breeding Females.
3. **Bred and Owned Division:** A Champion Bred and Owned female will be selected in each breed division (except Commercial) from the highest placing Bred and Owned animals in each class or group of classes. The junior exhibitor's name must be currently listed on the registration certificate as an owner or co-owner and also as the original breeder or co-breeder of the specific entry.
4. **Open Show:** Junior Exhibitors may enter the same breeding animal in both the Open and Junior Shows. Open and Junior shows must be entered and paid by the respective entry deadlines.

COMMERCIAL BREEDING FEMALE SHOW

The Commercial Breeding Show Entry Information is in addition the “Junior General Rules and Regulations” located on wistatefair.com.

1. **Entries** with complete information and fees must be submitted online to Wisconsin State Fair by the entry deadline.
2. **DNA Identification:** Any female being shown in the commercial breeding female division **MUST** have DNA identification on file with Wisconsin State Fair in the name of the exhibitor/sibling **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024**, even if the animal is registered with a National Breed Organization.
 - Example:** a registered Chianina Heifer with a registration certificate shown in the commercial female division must have a DNA sample submitted by the exhibitor/sibling.
 - A. Exhibitors who intentionally remove official 840 ear tags are subject to disciplinary actions.
 - B. Females not 840 ear tagged and DNA identified with Wisconsin State Fair by the exhibitor/sibling by May 22, 2024, are eligible to show but are not eligible for champion awards and will be identified as such during the weigh back or DNA verification processes and will receive the lowest class placing.
3. **Lost 840 Ear Tags:** Animals entered in the commercial breeding division must arrive at the Fair with the 840 ear tag intact. If an 840 ear tag is lost:
 - A. **By July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification, please email the exhibitor name, species, lost tag number, and replacement tag number to entryoffice@wistatefair.com.
 - B. **After July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification and arrives at the Fair without its original 840 ear tag identification, the animal will be disqualified. Exhibitors who would like to show the disqualified animal must enter the DNA Verification Process by submitting a DNA Verification Form, include a \$100 fee and agree to have a DNA sample taken at the Fair for DNA verification. The \$100 fee will be refunded if the sample is verified as matching the original sample submitted by the exhibitor/sibling.
4. **Declared Weight:** Commercial Breeding Heifers are shown by declared weight.
 - A. A declared weight card must be completed and submitted online by the designated time for each animal. The weight indicated on the submitted form will be the official declared show weight of the animal. There will be no changing of weights after the official declared weight has been submitted.
 - B. **Weigh Back:** Before each class, all animals must be weighed on the official scale by show management. Animals must be within 5% above or below the declared show weight entered by the exhibitor on the weight form. If an animal is not within its declared weight range (5% above or below), show management may authorize a reweigh. If an animal weighs out of its 5% declared weight range or does not report immediately to the scale to be weighed before class, it will receive the lowest class placing and will be ineligible for champion classes. There will be no weigh-back for breed champion or grand champion classes.
 - C. No private livestock scales are allowed on Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds. Exhibitors using a private scale will be disqualified from participating. Wisconsin State Fair will provide scales for exhibitors to use:
 - i. Monday, August 5: 9 am to 7 pm
 - ii. Tuesday, August 6: 7 am to completion of show

SPECIAL AWARDS – BREEDING FEMALES

Awards, courtesy of the **Wisconsin Junior Angus Association** will be provided for the Angus Breeding Female Division Champions and the Angus Bred and Owned Female Division Champions.

Awards, courtesy of the **Wisconsin Junior Hereford Association** will be provided to the Hereford Breeding Heifer, Hereford Bred and Owned Female, Hereford Steer, and Hereford Cow-Calf Champions.

MARKET STEER SHOW

The Market Steer Show Entry Information is in addition to the “Junior General Rules and Regulations” located on wistatefair.com.

1. **Entries** with complete information and fees must be submitted online to Wisconsin State Fair by the entry deadline.
 - A. **Market Steer:** Specific tattoo, registration certificate and 840 ear tag identification does not need to be listed when entered. Market steers must have 840 ear tag and DNA identification submitted by the exhibitor/sibling on file with Wisconsin State Fair **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024**, to be eligible for champion awards.
 - B. **Substitutions:** Market steer substitutes do not need to be declared at entry. All market steer substitutes must have DNA submitted by the exhibitor/sibling on file with Wisconsin State Fair **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024**, to be eligible.
2. **Each exhibitor is permitted to bring no more than two (2) steers total to the Fair.** A steer may show in the Market Steer, Performance, and Bred and Owned divisions if it meets each division’s qualifications and is appropriately entered.
3. Market steers should be born after January 1, 2023. Steers are subject to mouthing for “over-age”. Over-aged steers are ineligible to compete if the first permanent incisor tooth is in wear.
4. **DNA Identification:** All market steers **MUST** have DNA identification on file with Wisconsin State Fair in the name of the exhibitor/sibling **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024**, even if they are registered with a National Breed Organization. Once identified, market steers are subject to random 840 ear tag inspection and DNA verification testing at any time by Wisconsin State Fair officials.
 - A. Exhibitors who intentionally remove official 840 ear tags are subject to disciplinary actions.
 - B. Steers not DNA identified with Wisconsin State Fair by the exhibitor/sibling by May 22, 2024, are eligible to show but are not eligible for champion awards and will be identified as such during the weigh back or DNA verification processes and will receive the lowest class placing.
5. **Lost 840 Ear Tags:** Animals entered in the market division must arrive at the Fair with the 840 ear tag intact. If an 840 ear tag is lost:
 - A. **By July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification, please email the exhibitor name, species, lost tag number, and replacement tag number to entryoffice@wistatefair.com.
 - B. **After July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification and arrives at the Fair without its original 840 ear tag identification, the animal will be disqualified. Exhibitors who wish to show the disqualified animal must enter the DNA Verification Process by submitting a DNA Verification Form, include a \$100 fee and agree to have a DNA sample taken at the Fair for DNA verification. The \$100 fee will be refunded if the sample is verified as matching the original sample submitted by the exhibitor/sibling.
6. The market steer division is a non-terminal show. Exhibitors must remove all market steers from Wisconsin State Fair when released, except market steers selected for the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction.
7. All market steers must be free of all drug residue of any type, including prescribed, at time of show and be eligible for immediate harvest following the show. At any time, Fair management may elect to have samples taken including, but not limited to DNA, blood, urine, hair and tissue. Any carcass showing evidence of ante mortem tampering may result in the exhibitor of such animal(s) forfeiting ribbons, prize money, sale receipts, prizes awarded and result in loss of future exhibition privileges. Please refer to “Junior General Rules and Regulations” section on wistatefair.com for more information.
8. **Declared Weight:** Market steers will show by breed and declared weight.
 - A. A declared weight card must be completed and submitted online by the designated time for each animal. The weight indicated on the submitted form will be the official declared show weight of the animal. There will be no changing of weights after the official declared weight has been submitted.
 - B. **Weigh Back:** Before each class, all animals must be weighed on the official scale by show management. Animals must be within 5% above or below the show weight entered by the exhibitor on the weight form. If an animal is

not within its declared weight range (5% above or below) show management may authorize a reweigh. If an animal weighs out of its 5% declared weight range or does not report immediately to the scale to be weighed before class, it will receive the lowest class placing and will be ineligible for champion classes. There will be no weigh back for breed champion or grand champion classes.

- C. No private livestock scales are allowed on Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds. Exhibitors using a private scale will be disqualified from participating. Wisconsin State Fair will provide scales for exhibitors to use:
- I. Monday, August 5: 9 am to 7 pm
 - II. Tuesday, August 6: 7 am to 7 pm
 - III. Wednesday, August 8: 7 am to completion of show
9. **Registration Certificates:** A breed steer must have a national breed association registration certificate signifying it has met breed qualifications to show as a representative of the respective breed. **There are no registration certificate name or ownership date requirements for a breed division steer showing in the junior market steer show.** All breed steers are subject to DNA testing to verify parentage. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure parentage verification of sire and/or dam (depending on breed percentage qualifications) is on file with the respective association or attainable within 30 days of completion of the Fair. Any breed steer found to have different parents than what is identified on the original registration certificate presented at check-in may be disqualified and all prize money earned forfeited.

Examples:

- **Animal A - Breed A** must have both the dam and the sire registered to be issued a registration certificate as a breed. In this case, both sire and dam DNA verification is needed for parent verification.
 - **Animal B** - A steer is 50% or less of **Breed B** that may qualify it to be issued a registration certificate. In this case, whichever parent or parents recorded with the association get it to the percentage listed on the registration certificate must have DNA parentage verification on file. Please check with the respective breed association on specific requirements for registering steers.
 - **Animal C** - a steer recorded with the association being 51% or higher would need DNA verification of both sire and dam to meet requirement. Please check with breed associations on specific requirements for registering steers.
10. **Breed Divisions:** The Market Steer Show must have a minimum of ten (10) head of the same breed checked in at the Fair with proper breed verification to qualify as a breed division. Registration Certificates for breed division market steers must be submitted to the Junior Beef Office with the declared weight card.
- A. Breeds with proper breed verification but with less than ten head checked in at the Fair will show in the Any Other Breed division.
 - B. Breeds with proper breed verification but with less than ten head but more than five head checked in at the Fair will show as a breed class within the Any Other Breed division. Only one (1) Champion Market Steer and one (1) Reserve Champion Market Steer will be selected from all animals entered in the Any Other Breed division.
 - C. **Breed Division Qualifications** are as follows:
 - i. Angus: Registration certificate must be issued from the American Angus Association showing both the sire and dam to be registered Angus.
 - ii. Charolais: Registration certificate must be issued from American International Charolais Association and must show verification of **at least 50% or higher** Charolais breed required parentage.
 - iii. Chianina: Registration certificates must be issued by the American Chianina Association and must show verification of breed required parentage. All registered Chianina and Chianina influenced cattle (Chimaine, Chiangus, Chiford) will show in the same breed division.
 - iv. Dairy: All steers must meet registration and show requirements for the respective national breed association. All non-registered (commercial) or dairy breed crossbreds will have the option to show in the commercial dairy steer division or the crossbred market steer division. Breeds recognized as dairy are as follows: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, and Red & White Holstein.
 - v. Hereford: Registration paper or steer certificate must be issued from the American Hereford Association showing both the sire and dam to be registered Hereford.
 - vi. Maine-Anjou: Registration certificate must be issued from the American Maine-Anjou Association and must show verification of breed required parentage. All registered Maine-Anjou or Maintainer cattle will show in the same breed division.
 - vii. Shorthorn: Registration certificate (Red) must be issued from the American Shorthorn Association indicating the animal is of 15/16 Shorthorn parentage or higher.

- viii. Shorthorn Plus: Registration certificate (Green) must be issued from the American Shorthorn Association indicating the animal is under 15/16 Shorthorn parentage. Steers with less than 25% Shorthorn required parentage will show in the Crossbred Division.
- ix. Simmental: Registration certificates must be issued by the American Simmental Association and must show verification of **at least 50% or higher** Simmental breed required parentage. All registered Simmentals less than 50% will show in the Crossbred Division.
- x. All other breeds not listed above will need the appropriate breed association registration certificate recognizing breed parentage to their respective registration standards. If ten (10) of each breed are exhibited at the current Fair, there will be a specific class for that recognized breed regardless of percentage parentage in the respective breed. All other recognized breed association parentage verified cattle with less than ten (10) head exhibited will show in the Any Other Breed Division.

11. **Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction:** The Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction is produced and promoted by the Blue Ribbon Sales of Champions Foundation.

- A. The Grand Champion Market Steer, Reserve Grand Champion Market Steer and all qualified Breed Champions of the Junior Market Steer Show (except the Commercial Dairy Steer) must sell in the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction on Wednesday, August 7th in the Coliseum. These animals may **not** be withdrawn/scratched from the Auction.
- B. The Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction is a terminal auction. All animals sold at the Auction will be sent to a designated harvest facility from Wisconsin State Fair Park.
- C. Animals are sold for harvest only. Absolutely no animal can be taken to a private residence/commercial property/farm for any purpose.
- D. Any exhibitor whose Auction animal does not pass residue testing or DNA comparison or shows evidence of ante mortem tampering may forfeit Auction proceeds and Wisconsin State Fair awards.
- E. All identification on auction animals will stay with the animal and cannot be returned to the exhibitor or any other party.
- F. If an animal selected for the Auction was sold at a County Fair Auction, the exhibitor must notify the Blue Ribbon Sale of Champions Foundation after being named Champion and before the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction begins.

1. All steers must be bred by a WHA or WJHA member. The breeder must be a member at calving date. All steers must be born in Wisconsin.
2. All steers must be of purebred Hereford parentage. Steers need AHA registration papers or original AHA steer certificates stating purebred parentage for the sire and dam. Paperwork **MUST** be presented at check-in time. Faxed or photocopied certificates will **NOT** be accepted. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** The steer papers must be in the exhibitor's name. It may **NOT** be in the farm or parents name.
3. All eligible steers must be identified by a legible tattoo which matches the AHA steer certificate or registration paper.
4. Submission of DNA samples to Wisconsin State Fair must be completed by May 22, 2024, per Wisconsin State Fair rules.
5. All eligible steers must be nominated by June 15, 2024, by the breeder of the steer, who will submit a \$25 nomination fee (cap of \$100 per breeder) to Kermit Rhiner, Jackpot Steer Coordinator, W8838 Richards Rd, Poynette, WI 53955. Checks should be made payable to the WHA.
6. All eligible steers nominated by the breeder for the Jackpot Show must also be entered by the exhibitor, who will submit an entry form along with a \$25 entry fee, to Kermit Rhiner at the above address by June 15, 2024.
7. All eligible steers nominated by the breeder for the Jackpot Show must be entered and shown in the regular Wisconsin State Fair junior market steer classes and must meet the requirements of eligibility for the Wisconsin State Fair Junior Market Steer show.

DEWEY WACHOLZ PERFORMANCE STEER DIVISION

This program emphasizes the exhibitor's ability to select and raise steers that will be evaluated on the components of ultrasound carcass merit and visual appraisal. Performance steers are subject to all rules for drug residue and unethical practices listed in the Junior Beef section as well as the "Junior General Rules and Regulations" section located on wistatefair.com.

1. **Entries** with complete information and fees must be submitted online to Wisconsin State Fair.
 - A. Performance steers must be DNA identified by the exhibitor/sibling with Wisconsin State Fair by the May 22, 2024, entry deadline.
 - B. Steers in this division may be exhibited in the Market Steer division and/or the Bred and Owned division (if eligible) if properly entered with additional entry fees.
2. **Each exhibitor is permitted to exhibit no more than two (2) performance steers.** Overall placing will be based on:
 - A. **Ultrasound Carcass Component (70%): Ultrasound data will be collected at the Fair.** Steers will be evaluated on estimates of USDA yield and quality grades that determine carcass value. These grades will be estimated by using ultrasound to measure 12th rib fat thickness, ribeye area and marbling score. Value-Based Beef Carcass Evaluation favors carcasses which grade USDA Choice or higher and USDA Yield Grade 2 and lower.
 - B. **Visual Appraisal (Live Show) Component (30%):** Steers will show by official Fair weight. No adhesives/paints or like products can be used. The top steers in visual appraisal will be selected from the top two placings in each class.
3. **The Performance Steer Division is a non-terminal show;** performance steers must be taken home when released on Thursday, August 8, 2024.
4. **DNA Identification:** All performance steers **MUST** have DNA identification on file in the name of the exhibitor/sibling with Wisconsin State Fair **postmarked on or before May 22, 2024.** Once identified, performance steers are subject to random 840 ear tag inspection and DNA verification testing at any time by Wisconsin State Fair officials. Exhibitors who intentionally remove official 840 ear tags are subject to disciplinary actions. Steers not DNA identified by the

exhibitor/sibling by May 22, 2024, are eligible to show but are not eligible for champion awards and will be identified as such during the weigh back or DNA verification processes and will receive the lowest class placing.

5. **Lost 840 Ear Tags:** Animals entered in the market division must arrive at the Fair with the 840 ear tag intact. If an 840 ear tag is lost:
 - A. **By July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification, please email the exhibitor name, species, lost tag number, and replacement tag number to entryoffice@wistatefair.com.
 - B. **After July 15th:** If an animal loses its official 840 ear tag identification and arrives at the Fair without its original 840 ear tag identification, the animal will be disqualified. Exhibitors who would like to show the disqualified animal must enter the DNA Verification Process by submitting a DNA Verification Form, include a \$100 fee and agree to have a DNA sample taken at the Fair for DNA verification. The \$100 fee will be refunded if the sample is verified as matching the original sample submitted by the exhibitor/sibling.
6. All performance steers must be free of all drug residue of any type, including prescribed, at time of show and be eligible for immediate harvest following the show. The Junior Beef Superintendent may elect to have samples taken at any time including, but not limited to DNA, blood, urine, hair, and tissue. Any carcass showing evidence of ante mortem tampering may result in the exhibitor of such animal(s) forfeiting ribbons, prize money, sale receipts, prizes awarded and result in loss of future exhibition privileges. Please refer to the “Junior General Rules and Regulations” section on wistatefair.com for more information.

1. **Entries** with complete information and fees must be submitted online to Wisconsin State Fair.
 - A. **Bred and Owned Market Steers:** Specific tattoo and 840 ear tag identification do not need to be listed when entered.
 - B. **Breed Registration Certificates:** Only steers officially registered through a National Breed Association are eligible; Crossbreds are not eligible. Breed registration certificates must be available for inspection at the Fair.
 - C. **Eligibility:** The junior exhibitor must be listed as a current owner or co-owner and also as the original breeder or co-breeder on the registration certificate.
2. Steers in the Bred and Owned Market Steer division may be exhibited in the Market Steer Division and the Performance Division (if eligible) if appropriately entered with additional entry fees.
3. The Bred and Owned Market Steer division is a non-terminal show. Exhibitors must remove all Bred and Owned Market Steers from Wisconsin State Fair when released, except the Grand Champion Bred and Owned Market Steer (Over All Breeds) selected for the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction.

4. **Breed Divisions:** A minimum of two (2) head must be exhibited in order to have a breed division. If there are less than two (2) head in the respective breed, the animals will be shown in the Any Other Breed Division. Show management has the discretion to break the Any Other Breed Division into subclasses to enhance the competitive integrity of the show.
5. All bred and owned market steers must be free of all drug residue of any type, including prescribed, at time of show and be eligible for immediate harvest following the show. At any time, Fair management may elect to have samples taken including, but not limited to DNA, blood, urine, hair, and tissue. Any carcass showing evidence of ante mortem tampering may result in the exhibitor of such animal(s) forfeiting ribbons, prize money, sale receipts, prizes awarded and result in loss of future exhibition privileges. Please refer to the “Junior General Rules and Regulations” section on wistatefair.com for more information.
6. **Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction:** The Grand Champion Bred and Owned Market Steer (Over All Breeds) must sell in the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction on Wednesday, August 7th in the Coliseum.
 - A. If the Grand Champion Bred and Owned Market Steer (Over All Breeds) also qualifies for the auction as either the Grand Champion Market Steer, Reserve Grand Champion Market Steer, or as a Breed Champion, it will sell in the auction with all titles earned.
 - B. The Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction is a terminal auction. All animals auctioned will be sent to a designated harvest facility.
 - C. Animals are sold for harvest only. Absolutely no animal can be taken to a private residence/commercial property/farm for any purpose.
 - D. Any exhibitor whose Auction animal does not pass residue testing or DNA comparison or shows evidence of ante mortem tampering may forfeit Auction proceeds and Wisconsin State Fair awards.
 - E. All identification on auction animals will stay with the animal and cannot be returned to the exhibitor or any other party.
 - F. If an animal selected as the Grand Champion Bred and Owned Market Steer was sold at a County Fair Auction, the exhibitor must notify the Blue Ribbon Sale of Champions Foundation after being named Grand Champion and before the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction begins.
7. **Declared Weight:** Bred and Owned Market Steers will show by breed and declared weight.
 - A. A declared weight card must be completed and submitted to the Junior Beef office for each animal. The weight indicated on the submitted card will be the official declared show weight of the animal. There will be no changing of weights after the official declared weight card has been submitted.
 - B. **Weigh Back:** The top four placing animals may be weighed on the official scale by show management, either before or after placing at the judge’s/show management’s discretion. Animals must be within 5% above or below the declared show weight entered by the exhibitor on the weight card. If an animal is not within its declared weight range (5% above or below) show management may authorize a reweigh. If an animal weighs out of its 5% declared weight range or does not report immediately to the scale to be weighed, it will receive the lowest class placing and will be ineligible for champion classes. The remaining animals will move up one placing. There will be no weigh back for breed champion or grand champion classes.
 - C. No private livestock scales are allowed on Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds. Exhibitors using a private scale will be disqualified from participating. Wisconsin State Fair will provide scales for exhibitors to use:
 - i. Monday, August 5: 9 am to 7 pm
 - ii. Tuesday, August 6: 7 am to completion of show

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Only exhibitors in the department are eligible for the Junior Beef Cattle Showmanship Contest. Exhibitors must exhibit his/her own animal entered and checked in for one of the individual junior beef classes.
2. The same animal must be used in all heats and finals of Showmanship.
3. All exhibitors will be entered in Showmanship at no charge. Participation in Showmanship must be confirmed during check in at the Fair.
4. Fitting is optional.

HERDSMANSHIP (Beef Cattle)

To effectively promote projects and the agriculture industry to the public, the care and presentation of exhibits must be of high standards at all times during the Fair.

Every junior exhibitor at Wisconsin State Fair will be monitored for exhibit herdsmanship by Fair management. Herdsmanship will be based on decorations, appearance and cleanliness of display area, care given to animals, and general cooperation and attitude of exhibitor.

Herdsmanship Criteria

1. Preparation of the Exhibit
 - A. Decorations - Neat and attractive
 - B. Animal Arrangement - Animals correctly spaced and arranged (neither too close or too far apart)
 - C. Signs - Signs for each animal are appropriate and readable with complete information (***Please note: it is NOT required to display exhibitor hometown and parent names on animal signs. Exhibitors are reminded that Wisconsin State Fair is a large public event and to exercise prudence in sharing personal information with the public.***)
 - D. Tack Area – safe and well kept
2. Care of Exhibit
 - A. Animals - Animals cleaned, comfortable, tied properly
 - B. Aisles - Aisles clean and neat, adequate width for Fairgoers, no chutes, safe
 - C. Bedding – Bedding kept clean and odor free
 - D. Feed and Equipment - Neat and orderly storage, equipment clean and out of sight if possible
3. Appearance and Attitude of Exhibitor(s)
 - A. Knowledge and Courtesy - Friendly, able to answer questions from Fairgoers
 - B. Exhibitor Appearance - Clothes and person neat and clean, appropriate dress

Exhibits not practicing satisfactory herdsmanship as determined by Fair management using the herdsmanship criteria will be subject to the following consequences:

1st warning – Group contact or Independent exhibitor will receive a verbal or written warning indicating the exhibit needs improvement.

2nd warning – Group contact or Independent exhibitors will receive a written warning indicating improvements needed in exhibit.

3rd warning – The Group contact or Independent exhibitor will receive a written letter of reprimand noting the lack of compliance presenting a positive image of the project to the public. The Group or youth involved will be immediately released from the Fair and will lose all prize money or awards won. A report detailing the three warnings will be filed with the Agriculture Director. The Agriculture Director may present a recommendation to the WSFP Board Agriculture Committee for possible future disciplinary actions.

BEST EDUCATIONAL EXHIBIT (Beef Cattle)

Awards will be presented to the best three exhibits (group or individual) having a worthy exhibit geared toward educating consumers. The educational exhibit can be part of the existing decorations.

QUIZ CONTEST (Beef Cattle)

Please note: Entry in the 2024 Quiz Contest must be made with your online entries, no later than the late Junior Entry Deadline. On-site entries will not be accepted.

The Quiz Contest consists of multiple-choice questions and provides junior exhibitors an opportunity to demonstrate both their project knowledge and knowledge of the beef industry. Tie breaker questions are determined in advance. Entrants must be active exhibitors in the junior beef cattle department, with his/her own animal entered and checked in for one of the individual junior beef cattle classes.

Junior exhibitors participate in an individual interview related to a beef industry topic. Judges score exhibitors on how effectively they communicate and advocate for their industry. Entrants must be active exhibitors in the junior beef cattle department, with his/her own animal entered and checked in for one of the individual junior beef cattle classes.

JUNIOR BEEF CATTLE SUPREME EXHIBITOR AWARD

The Junior Beef Cattle Supreme Exhibitor award is based on the exhibitor's overall achievements at the 2024 Wisconsin State Fair. All Junior Beef exhibitors who actively exhibit at the Fair are eligible. The award is announced in the fall of 2024.

Wisconsin State Fair will automatically enter/calculate points for active Junior Beef exhibitors as follows:

1. Animal Placing (150 total points)

Exhibitors will receive points for each of his/her **two highest placing animals** in the Junior Beef Divisions (Breeding and Market/Performance /Market Bred and Owned). Only one placing will be considered per animal; the animal's highest class placing earned will be calculated (**Example:** a Steer exhibited in both the Performance and Bred and Owned divisions will only receive points for the division in which the animal places highest.)

Points are not assigned for Champion awards. Points are awarded for each placing as follows:

JUNIOR SHOW EXHIBITOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

ANIMAL CARE and EXHIBITOR SAFETY

1. All exhibits receive the best care and protection the surroundings will afford, but they are always subject to the owner's risk. All exhibitors are expected to conform to Wisconsin State Fair participation and exhibition policies. Failure to comply may result in award and prize money forfeiture, dismissal from the grounds, and being barred from immediate and/or future exhibitions. Wisconsin State Fair management reserves the right to interpret and enforce the rules and regulations; split or combine classes; accept or reject any entry entirely, partially, or conditionally.
2. All exhibitors are strongly encouraged to display positive animal care/welfare practices while at the Fair. Wisconsin State Fair management reserves the right to disqualify and/or remove exhibitors/entries deemed by Fair management not presenting positive care/animal welfare practices. Refer to the "Junior General Rules and Regulations" section on wistatefair.com for statements about drug testing/unethical fitting and additional rules and information.
3. Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all animals are restricted to their assigned barn area. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. The department superintendent has the discretion to approve special circumstances.
4. No animals are allowed at the designated Wisconsin State Fair off-site parking lots.
5. No animals other than those entered will be permitted in the barn (**no** newborn young).
6. Pets, whether on a leash or carried or in a container, are not permitted on site during the Fair, unless the pet is part of a Fair event, e.g. K-9 Sports. Service animals are, of course, permitted.
7. Once any animal/bird is checked in at the Fair they shall not be removed from the Fair unless released by the Superintendent or Wisconsin State Fair veterinarian.
8. **Animal Inspection:** All animals may be examined at any time while they are on Fair Park grounds by Wisconsin State Fair management or a Wisconsin State Fair veterinarian. Sheep prolapsing, showing symptoms/exhibiting ringworm, fungus or

other contagious diseases will be disqualified. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall not be permitted to exhibit and must be removed immediately from the Fair Park. The decision of a Wisconsin State Fair veterinarian regarding the health of an animal and suitability for exhibition is **final** and not subject to appeal.

9. **Animal Treatment:** While on Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds, the Wisconsin State Fair on-site veterinarian must administer all medication, treatments, and therapies.
 - A. The Wisconsin State Fair on-site veterinarian will inspect, treat, and record all information on an official 3-ply Treatment Record Form. There will be no charge for the Wisconsin State Fair Veterinarian to treat an animal. Only medication costs will be charged to exhibitors.
 - B. The Wisconsin State Fair on-site veterinarian trailer is on 5th Street north of the Double Deck Barn. The animal treatment tent for horses and cattle is on 5th Street; the animal treatment tent for goats, sheep, swine, poultry and rabbits is located just north of the Swine and Goat Barn. This is the only area to be used to administer treatments (oral, IM, IV, subcutaneous, and alternative treatments/therapies).
 - C. Exhibitors are not allowed to move animals from the barn to the treatment areas without a Wisconsin State Fair veterinarian present.
 - D. Exhibitors who violate the authorized treatment protocol may be disqualified.
10. For animal welfare, public safety and liability reasons exhibitors may not use space in or around their exhibits to conduct any type of direct contact/petting/feeding or photo opportunities geared toward fairgoers/public.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. **Online Entry** – To enter online, please go to entry.wistatefair.com. Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express are accepted. Any online entry not completed and paid by 7 pm Central Time on May 22, 2024, is considered late and will be charged late fees; entries not paid by 5 pm Central Time on May 29, 2024, will not be accepted.
2. All entries must be made in accordance with the terms and conditions. There are no refunds of entry fees once entries have been accepted. Entries are not accepted over the phone. There is no swapping or reselling of entries.
3. Entries will not be considered complete unless all required information is fully completed and full remittance is submitted online. **Entries must contain complete exhibitor information** (including properly completed form W-9) **and complete animal information** as required by each department (including for example: birthdate, ear notch, ear tag/scrapie tag, name, registration number, etc.). Entries without required information and/or fees, including department fees (including but not limited to horse fees, stall fees, pen fees, etc.) will not be accepted. See the “Junior Rules and Regulations” section on wistatefair.com for additional rules.
4. Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to reject, accept, or conditionally accept any entry or late entry from any exhibitor.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION AND OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. **Ownership Requirements:** Junior exhibitors may enter and show **owned, co-owned and non-owned** breeding stock animals. There are no mandated registration paper ownership requirements and/or registration/transfer deadlines for owned, co-owned and non-owned animals.
 - A. **Owned:** animals registered in the name of the Junior exhibitor only.
 - B. **Co-Owned:** animals registered in the name of the Junior exhibitor and another person(s) or farm.
 - C. **Non-Owned:** animals registered in the name of anyone other than the Junior exhibitor.
2. **Bred and Owned Requirements:** The junior exhibitor’s name must be currently listed on the registration certificate as an owner or co-owner of the entry, and also as the original breeder or co-breeder.
3. **Registration Certificates:** The breed association original, a breed association duplicate, and emails directly from the breed associations to verify registration will be accepted and checked by Wisconsin State Fair management or authorized breed association representatives.
4. **Identification:** All animals are subject to a permanent identification and age inspection by representatives of the breed associations, Wisconsin State Fair on-site veterinarian, or Wisconsin State Fair management. Questionable age verification will be determined by Wisconsin State Fair management and that decision is final.

CLASS ELIGIBILITY

1. **Any Other Breed Division:** Registered animals **MUST** show in the offered/published breed division (if applicable). If no breed division exists, the animal will be shown in the Any Other Breed Division if offered. Animals shown in the Any Other Breed Division must be registered through their national breed association. An animal registered with multiple national breed associations may only be shown in one breed division at the current Fair.

2. **Champion Classes:** Only first and second place winners in the respective classes are eligible to compete for champion and reserve champion awards. All first-place animals are required to show in champion classes unless excused by the Superintendent.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY:

Junior Division competitions, contests, exhibits, demonstrations and special activity opportunities are provided by Wisconsin State Fair for Wisconsin residents/participants who have a desire to demonstrate outstanding youth achievement. Youth are encouraged to actively participate in youth educational programs/organizations which enhance project awareness but there are no youth organization membership requirements to exhibit in Youth Expo or the Junior animal Departments of Wisconsin State Fair. Wisconsin State Fair Park does not and shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), physical ability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations.

1. **Age Requirement – Animal Shows:** Participation in Wisconsin State Fair Junior livestock and small animal shows (beef, dairy cattle, boer and dairy goats, poultry, rabbit, sheep and swine) is open to any Wisconsin resident 12-19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year.
2. **Wisconsin Residence Requirement:** Eligible youth must be residents of Wisconsin or have been approved as eligible by Wisconsin State Fair as of January 1st for 2024. Application for non-resident approval must be made to the Wisconsin State Fair Agriculture Department Director or a designee prior to January 1st for the current year's Fair (email entryoffice@wistatefair.com). Consideration for approval of non-resident participation will only be reviewed for non-Wisconsin residents who are affiliated with Wisconsin-based youth organizations and/or Wisconsin County Fairs and who do not exhibit in County/State Fairs in another state. Applicants will be notified of approval/declination by January 31st.
3. **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Certified at time of entry: Certification must be active for the dates of the Fair.** All junior exhibitors exhibiting animals in any Junior Departments must be YQCA certified at the time of entry. The certification must remain active through the dates of the Fair. The YQCA certification program is a national education program built around foundational pillars of animal agriculture (animal welfare, food safety and character education). The program is offered online or in person at regional locations throughout Wisconsin. For more information go to yqcaprogram.org.

EXHIBITOR VENDING: Junior exhibitors are not permitted to sell anything (goods or services) to Fairgoers and exhibitors out of their assigned exhibitor space.

FEED AND BEDDING Service: Wisconsin State Fair will have limited amounts of feed and bedding for sale. Orders may be placed during the Fair but to ensure availability exhibitors are encouraged to place orders in advance.

Advance Orders: Order forms can be found on wistatefair.com in June. Orders can be mailed or emailed to entryoffice@wistatefair.com after June 15th.

All orders must be paid in full **at the entry office** before receiving an official exhibitor release. Check or credit card payments will be accepted. Checks should be made payable to Wisconsin State Fair. In the event of nonpayment, prize money will be withheld, and future entries will not be accepted until the balance is settled.

Feed and bedding orders will be delivered mornings and evenings during the Fair. Orders placed in the morning will be delivered that evening. Orders placed in the afternoon/evening will be delivered the next morning. Please plan your needs accordingly.

FITTING: Fitting includes, but is not limited to, the day-to-day management practices of feeding, exercising and show preparation. Complete information regarding junior fitting rules is found in the Junior General Rules and Regulations on wistatefair.com.

SHOWRING EXPECTATIONS

1. Animals deemed uncontrollable and unsafe to exhibit will be dismissed from the showring and/or Wisconsin State Fair grounds. Show management retains the right to warn the exhibitor and dismiss any animal deemed unsafe or uncontrollable at any time. No prize money will be awarded if an animal is dismissed.
2. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have entries ready to enter the showring when show management calls for the class to enter the ring. Animals must enter the show ring when the class is called. The judge, ring steward or show management has the right to determine the deadline for late arrivals and close the class. Any exhibitor who misses his/her class is not a contender for the prize money offered. Classes will not be re-run for any animals missing a class. If an animal misses a class, the animal cannot be put in another class to be judged.

3. Exhibitors are required to wear an official harness or clip to display the assigned (5"x 7") exhibitor number when in the ring. Exhibitors must wear the correct exhibitor number to have their animal considered for placement by a judge. Violators will not be permitted to enter the ring.
4. All exhibitors must be properly dressed while in the show ring. No firm, farm or name identification shall be carried, worn or displayed on the exhibitor or animal while in the makeup area or the show ring. Fair management may remove the exhibitor/animal from these areas until compliance is met.
5. Judges have been carefully selected. All exhibitors making entry for the Fair accept these judges and agree to abide by their decisions. It is prohibited for exhibitors to contact or attempt to contact a judge pertaining to judging of classes after the judge has accepted the assignment of judging at the Wisconsin State Fair. No exhibitor should socialize, fraternize, or visit with a judge during the show(s). If any exhibitor, exhibitor's family member, employee, or adult facilitator attempts to interfere with the judge in any manner, the exhibitor shall forfeit all prize money awarded and may be excluded from further competition. The decision of the judge will be final in all cases. Judges are not permitted to show in classes they are judging. Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to change judges at any time.
6. The decision of the judge will be final in all cases except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion not discovered at the time of the award is proven. The Agriculture Director reserves the right to consult with the Wisconsin State Fair Agriculture Committee on any or all cases.
7. Each animal shall be exhibited to the entire satisfaction of the judges. After a class has started no animal(s) shall be permitted to leave the ring before the entire class has been judged/placed without the approval of the judge. Upon final placing, exhibitors are requested to remain in position in line or parade while the judge is giving his/her reasons. Any violation of this rule will cause forfeiture of all prize money won by the exhibitor.
8. Regardless of the number of exhibitors competing in a class, the judge may recommend any placing at his or her discretion. Judges will not place unworthy entries.
9. Should a first placed entry be disqualified after winning its class, but before its respective division championship, the second and third place animals will move up to first and second in the class and compete for champion in the division. If a second-place animal is disqualified, the third-place animal will move up. Should a division animal champion be disqualified after winning its division but before selection of Grand Champion, the reserve division champion will move up to champion and compete for Grand Championship. In this case, no attempt will be made to replace the division reserve champion. If a division reserve champion animal is disqualified, no shifting upward will occur and no attempt to replace the reserve champion will be made.
10. **Junior Exhibitors must show the animals they entered** unless the Superintendent has granted prior approval. Approval may be considered for the following reasons: multiple animals in the same class, multiple animals in the show ring at the same time in different species, serious injury, or hardship. An exhibitor substitution form to request approval for another active (checked in and actively showing within the department) Wisconsin State Fair junior exhibitor to show the exhibition animal may be obtained from the Superintendent's office and must be submitted to the department Superintendent by 7 pm the day prior to the start of the show.
11. **Junior Exhibitor Conduct:** Wisconsin State Fair management has the authority without liability or recourse to the Wisconsin State Fair Park Board to bar any exhibitor or his/her representatives in the event of a discourteous act to a judge or an official of the Fair and will have the power to disqualify the entry/entries of said exhibitor. In the event of such disqualification, the exhibitor forfeits all fees paid as well as any prize money and awards won.

STALLING and EQUIPMENT

1. **Barn Hours:** Stalls and animals must be kept accessible to the public while the barn is open (9am to 9pm).
2. No one is allowed to sleep in the barns.
3. Exhibitors are encouraged to decorate their stalling area to promote a positive image of agriculture.
4. All waste, feed, manure and trash should be disposed of properly.
5. **Stall Equipment:** Exhibitors are encouraged to bring pen dividers for separating animals and designating tack areas. Pen dimensions in the Sheep Barn are 5' wide x 7' deep x 46" tall; in the Swine Barn, pens are 6' wide x 8' deep x 42" tall. Horse stalls are 10' x 10'. No equipment is approved for use in the aisles.
6. **Bedding:**
 - a. The use of sand for bedding is prohibited.
 - b. Exhibitors using carpeting must remove all carpeting prior to leaving the Fair.

- c. Dairy Cattle: No more than 8 inches of straw pack is recommended. Large square bales are permitted but the use of motorized handling equipment is prohibited. Wisconsin State Fair is not responsible or liable for movement. Large bales left behind after the show may be subject to a removal fee.
- 7. **Extension Cords:** All cords must conform to manufacturer and Wisconsin State Fair recommendations for safety. No cords will be permitted in the aisles or in public areas (above or on a surface) without being properly secured. Wisconsin State Fair management retains the authority to determine what is acceptable.
- 8. **Fans:**
 - a. **Beef and Dairy Cattle:** The use of one (1) fan no larger than 24" in diameter per animal is allowed.
 - b. **Goats, Sheep, and Swine:** the use of one (1) fan no larger than 24" in diameter per pen is allowed.
 - c. All fans must conform to manufacturer and Wisconsin State Fair recommendations for safety. Overhead fans must be hung from the front wall on either side of the pen. Floor fans may only be used to move air for the entire display and must be kept out of the aisles. The Superintendent reserves the right to determine acceptable placement and usage.
 - d. No other air movement, chilling and/or cooling devices are allowed.
- 9. **Generators:** The use of portable power sources is permitted. Generators must be kept a minimum of 5' from buildings in the designated locations on the Fairgrounds.
- 10. **Gas/Diesel/Propane Storage Containers:** Containers holding hazardous/flammable materials cannot be stored on the grounds.
- 11. **Livestock Scales:** No personal livestock scales are allowed on Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds. Exhibitors using an unofficial scale will be disqualified from participating and/or placing, and prize money in the shows will be forfeited.
- 12. **Show Equipment:** Show boxes, feed, bedding, and other show equipment used for the care of livestock must be kept neatly in the exhibitor's designated area and out of the public aisles. All livestock and livestock housing areas must be kept orderly and safe to demonstrate a positive image of animal agriculture to the public.
- 13. **Grooming Chutes/Grooming Stands/Milking Stands:** Chutes/Stands are only allowed in the barn aisles 60 minutes before the show until 30 minutes after the show. Exhibitors using chutes/stands must store them out of the public walkways. Chutes/Stands **MUST** be placed in tack areas or other designated areas when not in use for fitting.
- 14. Exhibitors may not bring their own skidsters or other machinery to offload any equipment or supplies. Wisconsin State Fair is not able to unload personal equipment and supplies.

Admissions, Parking and Lodging

- 1. Exhibitors may choose downloadable or mailed exhibitor admission tickets at time of order.
- 2. All exhibitors and family members must have valid admission to enter the Fair Park August 1-11, 2024.
- 3. Each admission ticket can only be scanned once. If an exhibitor would like to exit and re-enter the Fair Park during the day, he or she **MUST** get his or her hand stamped at the admission gates.
- 4. Admission tickets which are wet, sun-damaged, lost or stolen will not be replaced. No refunds are given for any unused admission tickets.
- 5. Admission fees do not include vehicle parking.

EXHIBITOR PARKING

1. Vehicle Parking:

A. Blue Ribbon Off-site Parking: Free

- i. Off-site Agriculture Exhibitor vehicle parking lot with easy access from I-94.

- ii. This lot has 24-hour attendant, in and out privileges and overnight parking.
 - iii. A free shuttle will be run continuously from noon, Monday, July 29^h, through the duration of the Fair. The shuttle will pick up and drop off near Gate 5.
 - iv. Trailers are not allowed to park in this lot (see trailer parking below).
- B. **General Fair Park Parking:** \$15 per day/vehicle.
- i. Valid for one vehicle admission per day (no in and out privileges).
 - ii. Purchase upon arrival at any vehicle access gate (except Gate 5). Parking is not guaranteed.
 - iii. No overnight parking is allowed
2. **Trailer Parking:** A **free** Wisconsin State Fair off-site trailer parking lot will be available and assigned upon arrival. All trailers **MUST** be parked offsite. Exhibitors cannot sleep in their trailers overnight or keep any animals in trailers at the offsite lots.

HOUSING OPTIONS

1. Wisconsin State Fair Livestock barns are not approved for overnight sleeping accommodations by the local fire department. Sleeping in the barns is not permitted.

Thompson Youth Center:** VAGCs are given the first opportunity to rent Youth Center rooms for their group use during Junior Show sessions; VAICs are eligible to rent a room if space permits after the VAGC reservation period is closed. Rooms may be occupied only by approved VAGCs, VAICs and Junior exhibitors showing in the current session. Wisconsin State Fair will send reservation forms directly to all approved VAGCs in April.
